Described by **George Frideric Handel** (1685-1759) as a "magic opera" before the World Premiere at Covent Garden in 1735, his opera seria *Alcina* is about love and power, magic, manipulation and dissimulation. The title heroine, an unhappy sorceress from the Renaissance epic poem *Orlando furioso*, amuses herself on her magic island with one lover after another, before turning them into animals or stones. Sorcery aside, Alcina is a charismatic woman, whose own wiles and strengths won her political influence and countless lovers. But her magic dwindles, when she falls in love with Ruggiero, who found himself in Alcina's realm by chance, and falls for her charms. He might have suffered the same fate as his predecessors if his fiancée Bradamante (disguised as Ricciardo) hadn't decided to come and save him and destroy Alcina's powers. The dizzy-making merry-go-round of love keeps turning: Alcina's sister Morgana falls in love with "Ricciardo", making her beloved Oronte jealous. The chaos of emotions becomes complete when Ruggiero thinks Bradamante, disguised as Ricciardo, wants to seduct Alcina ...

The opera's modernity shines through not least by having a powerful female protagonist, even though she's about to experience a tragic downfall. The action's accompanied by bouncy, rhythmic, tirelessly propelling forward baroque music, out of which the countertenor's sarabande "Verdi prati" and soprano aria "Ah! mio cor! schernito sei!" stand out in particular.

Alcina is **Monika Buczkowska-Ward**, a Member of the Ensemble at Oper Frankfurt since the 2020/21 season. Ruggiero is a guest, the young countertenor **Elmar Hauser**, who was recently nominated as "Up and coming Artist of the Year" by Opernwelt magazine. He recently sang Orfeo and Ariodante and won 1st prize at the Concorso Lirico Internazionale "CLIP" in Portofino in the summer of 2024. Bradamante is sung by **Katharina Magiera**, and Morgana by **Shelén Hughes**, who won the George and Nora Foundation Competition and reached the finals of the "Renata Tebaldi" competition this year. Oberto, Oronte and Melisso are performed by a former member of the opera studio and ensemble members **Clara Kim**, **Michael Porter** and **Erik van Heyningen**. Conducting the Opern and Museumsorchester is **Julia Jones**, who recently led a revival of Cimarosa's *L'italiana in Londra* in Frankfurt. **Johannes Erath's** new production sees Handel's complex characters as people at a crossroads: how will they react in extreme situations? React to unexpected twists and turns? How do their (mistaken) paths, obsessions and emotions change at a given point on a "magic island", where societal norms don't exist? How far reaching are Alcina's arts, the power of her "magic"?
