After his huge success with *Mitridate* 15 year old **Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart** (1756-1791) only had a few weeks to finish *Ascanio in Alba* in time for a wedding in the Habsburg family: Maria Theresia commissioned the work for her son's Ferdinand Karl's marriage to Maria Beatrice d'Este, one of the Duke of Modena's daughters. Mozart's librettist came up with an ingenious combination of mythology, praise of the monarchy and allegory. The very successful first performance of this Festa teatrale took place at the Teatro Regio Ducale in Milan in 1771, and is now being heard in Frankfurt for the first time.

Venus informs her son Ascanio that Silvia is his intended bride. He's a bit nervous about this as he's never met her. The Goddess reveals that Amor, in the form of Ascanio, has been appearing in Silvia's dreams for four years. He's allowed to meet her to sound her out, but not say who he is. Silvia falls in love with stranger, but spurns him out of loyalty to her future husband Ascanio, who she's never met. Venus triumphantly marries the young couple.

It's conducted in the Bockenheimer Depot by Kapellmeister and Assistant to the GMD Alden Gatt. who then leads performances of the New Production of Mozart's Le nozze di Figaro, and soloists' coach Lukas Rommelspacher (December 28th, 30th 2023). Nina Brazier, a director's assistant at Oper Frankfurt since 2018 is making her directorial debut for the company. All roles are sung by Members of Oper Frankfurt's Ensemble and Opera Studio: The Ukrainian soprano Kateryna Kasper (Venus) also sings Micaëla in Carmen this season and Aci (role debut) in Handel's Aci, Galatea e Polifemo in Montréal – a role she then performs in concert in Basel and Vienna. Her American Ensemble Colleague Cecelia Hall (Ascanio) can be heard soon singing roles including Marzelline (Le nozze di Figaro) and 2nd Lady (Die Zauberflöte), as well as her first Angelina in Rossini's La Cenerentola at Boston Lyric Opera. Furthermore she performs in Mozart's Requiem with the New York Philharmonic. Swedish soprano Karolina Bengtsson (Silvia) repeats her portrayal of Pamina (Die Zauberflöte) and then sings more new roles, Belisa and a Young Shepherd in New Productions of Wolfgang Fortner's Don Perlimpín's Love for Belisa in his garden and Wagner's Tannhäuser here. A Member of the Opera Studio, Andrew Kim (Aceste) can be heard singing roles in Salome and Carmen this season. Soprano Anna Nekhames (Fauno) follows Venus and the Chief of the Gepopo (Le Grand Macabre) up with Belisa's Mother in Don Perlimpín's Love for Belisa in his garden – all role debuts.
