Le nozze di Figaro revealed considerable courage on the part of **Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart** (1756-1791): because Beaumarchais' *La folle journée, ou Le mariage de Figaro*, on which it was based, was banned in France and Vienna. His librettist Lorenzo da Ponte deployed diplomatic artistry to defuse the politically explosive nature of the play. When the World Premiere took place on May 1st 1786 at the Burgtheater in Vienna its impact was not quite as shocking as the play's – but its dig at the nobility was clear. Their adaptation shows a timelessly relevant human comedy, which was initially met with disdain, for the above reason, but gradually became one of Mozart's best loved operas. This New Production follows Guillaume Bernardi's, which opened at Oper Frankfurt in 2006/07.

As the day of Figaro and Susanna's wedding dawns Count Almaviva is determined to avail himself of his right to his "feudal first night". This turns the lovers, his wife Rosina and almost all the other inhabitants in the castle against him, culminating in a day full of intrigues, disguises, confusion and misunderstandings, at the end of which the Count is left suitably chastened ...

This New Production is led by the 1993 in Dachau born conductor Thomas Guggeis, who took up the post of General Music Director of Oper Frankfurt at the start of the 2023/24 season. He made his House Debut with Mozart's Requiem in May 2021, which was followed by Strauss' Ariadne auf Naxos. He was appointed Staatskapellmeister of the Staatsoper in Berlin in 2019/20. After studying in Munich and Milan and assisting at Berlin's Staatsoper, he worked as Kapellmeister at the Staatsoper in Stuttgart from 2018 to 2020. He conducts regularly at the Vienna State Opera and recently made his debuts at the Metropolitan Opera and Santa Fe Festival - Der Fliegende Holländer, both times - and his debut at La Scala Milan is planned for February 2024. Later performances in the first run of Mozart's Figaro are conducted by the American Alden Gatt, who joins the company this season as Kapellmeister and Assistant to the GMD. Director Tilmann Köhler, who staged many plays before moving into opera, is a popular guest in Frankfurt, where he returns in early 2024 for Alexander Zemlinsky's Der Traumgörge / George the Dreamer. Led by Kihwan Sim (Figaro), Elena Villalón (Susanna), Danylo Matviienko (Count Almaviva) and Kelsey Lauritano (Cherubino) the casts are made up predominantly of Members (and former Members) of Oper Frankfurt's Ensemble and Opera Studio. Guest artist include the Italian bass Donato Di Stefano (Bartolo) and Guatemalan soprano Adriana González, who made her debut in Germany at Oper Frankfurt as the Countess in 2020/21. Now she's back to sing a role again with which she enjoyed great success at the 2023 Salzburg Festival.
