By falling back on Ludovico Ariosto's 1516 epic poem *Orlando furioso* **George Frideric Handel** (1685-1759) hoped to breath new life into his operatic enterprises in London. He risked a new start in 1729 after the Royal Academy of Music 1728 ran out of money. But he was only able to build on past successes to a limited extent with revivals of older works such as *Rinaldo* and new opera serias including *Ezio*. Getting to grips with *Orlando*, performed for the first time at the King's Theatre, Haymarket, London in 1733, gave him the opportunity to break with archaic operatic conventions and present London audiences with an emotionally profound work full of baroque magic and enlightened morality.

The story: The warrior Orlando has lost his bearings. Should he be striving for happiness in love or glory? The magician Zoroastro wants to put him back on the path to military valour, but Orlando digs his heels in: He wants to be a hero among lovers instead of fighting. His adored Angelica, whose life Orlando once saved, loves Medoro, a soldier. When Orlando finds out, he loses his mind, killing Angelica and Medoro in a jealous rage. Zoroastro's magic saves the lovers and, finally, restores Orlando's sanity. Full of remorse he promises to control his passions in the future. The shepherdess Dorinda suffers from unrequited love too: She had her eyes on Medoro, who turned her down with a heavy heart. Dorina deals with her heartache more calmly than Orlando: She ends up inviting everyone to her home to sing the praises of love and glory.

The production is led by Italian born **Simone Di Felice**, a Kapellmeister at Oper Frankfurt since 2017/18. He recently conducted performances of Verdi's *Rigoletto* and Bizet's *Carmen*, Mozart's *Le nozze di Figaro* (2020/21) and a revival of Handel's *Radamisto* (2019/20). The director **Ted Huffman** projects include Stefan Wirth's *Girl with a Pearl Earring* (April 2022) and Gounod's *Roméo et Juliette* (April 2023) at Zurich Opera. Now he's back at Oper Frankfurt, where he made his debut in Germany with *Rinaldo* in the Bockenheimer Depot (September 2017), which was followed by a controversially received *Zauberflöte* earlier this season. The cast is made up almost entirely from singers from Oper Frankfurt's Ensemble: **Zanda Švēde** (Orlando), **Kateryna Kasper** (Angelica), **Monika Buczkowska** (Dorinda) and **Božidar Smiljanić** (Zoroastro), who are joined by American born **Christopher Lowrey** (Medoro), one of the leading countertenors of the younger generation, who has appeared at many leading international houses.
