This lavishly cast, elaborate operetta about robbers, which was very popular since the romantic era, shows us **Jacques Offenbach** (1819-1880), that master of satirical biting wit and virtuosic situation comedy at the height of his creativity. He composed his three act Opéra bouffe *The Bandits*, with his librettists Henri Meilhac and Ludovic Halévy, in only three months. Now this work, which received its World Premiere in 1869 at the Théâtre des Variétés in Paris, is being performed for the first time in Frankfurt on January 28th 2024.

Robber chieftain Falsacappa's bandits are unhappy about the hauls from their latest robberies. Falsacappa's daughter fell in love with Fragoletto, and vice versa, during the recent raid on his farm. Now he wants to be a bandit too and kidnaps a cabinet's courier. Papers found on him reveal that the Princess of Granada is on her way to marry the Prince of Mantua. Her dowry consists to a large extent of debts owed by the Mantuans to Spain. The remaining sum is to be handed over to the delegation from Granada. Falsacappa cooks up a plan ...

Conductor of this first ever performance in Frankfurt is **Karsten Januschke**, who worked at Oper Frankfurt until 2015 – where he was made a Kapellmeister. Last season he led revivals of *Eugene Onegin* and Handel's *Tamerlano* and forthcoming projects include *Hänsel und Gretel* at the Staatsoper in Stuttgart. **Katharina Thoma**, who directed a Pergolesi *Stabat Mater | La serva padrona* double bill and *Tristan und Isolde* in Frankfurt in 2020/21, recently staged a new *Frau ohne Schatten* at Cologne Opera and *Rusalka* at the Staatstheater in Karlsruhe. With the exception of **Yves Saelens** (Pietro) and **Peter Bronder** (Antonio) the cast is made up of **Members (and former Members) of Oper Frankfurt's Ensemble and Opera Studio**. The Austrian-Australian tenor **Gerard Schneider** (Falsacappa) sings Narraboth (*Salome*) here again this season and Léopold as a role debut in a new staging of Fromental Halévy's *La Juive*. American soprano **Elizabeth Reiter** (Fiorella) recently sang Amanda in Ligeti's *Le Grand Macabre* for the first time. **Kelsey Lauritano** (Fragoletto) sang Cherubino in the new *Le nozze di Figaro*; this Japanese-American mezzosoprano can also be heard again as Emilia in Rossini's *Otello*. **Peter Marsh** (The Prince of Mantua) thrilled audiences here as Piet the Pot in Ligeti's *Le Grand Macabre* this season.
