Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756–1791) was going through a period of radical upheaval when he started writing his Singspiel *Zaide* in 1779. It's far more than just a trial run for *Entführung aus dem Serail* as it marked a turning point, with Mozart putting the frustrating set-up in Salzburg behind him and becoming artistically independent. In this „serious German Singspiel“ Mozart combined things „Turkish“, very en vogue at the time, with a psychologically sensitive exploration of the human soul in the spirit of Enlightenment. As the world inherited an unfinished work, without an overture, ending abruptly after a failed attempt to escape by the protagonists, it offers plenty of scope for interpretation. **David Hermann's** production highlights its darker facets by combining it with excerpts from Mozart's incidental music for the play *Thamos, King of Egypt*, evoking associations to constraints in place around the world today.

The plot: The slave girl Zaide and Gomatz fall in love while being held prisoner by cruel Sultan Soliman. They attempt to escape with Allazim, but are caught and brought before the furious despot. Threatened with the death sentence, Allazim begs that the lovers be pardoned. There Mozart's manuscript ends: Will Soliman exact revenge or be magnanimous and forgive?

This season's first New Production in the Bockenheimer Depot is led by **George Petrou**. This Greek conductor made his debut at Oper Frankfurt in November 2024 with George Frideric Handel's *Partenope*. He is artistic director of the International Handel Festival in Göttingen and the Armonia Atenea Orchester in Athens. His success has been acknowledged by many awards (including an Echo Klassik for Opera Recording of the Year for Handel's *Tamerlano*), nominations (including for a 2018 Grammy for Handel's *Ottone*) and prize-winning recordings for leading labels (Deutsche Gramophon, DECCA, MDG etc). He recently conducted a New Production of Rossini's *Tancredi* at Cologne Opera and *Deidamia* at the Handel Festival in Halle. **David Hermann** is back in Frankfurt to direct, following on from his very impressive staging of Alberic Magnard's *Guerceur*, for which set designer **Jo Schramm** was voted „Best Set Designer“ at the 2026 Oper! Awards. The season's 2nd New Production is cast entirely by **Members of Oper Frankfurt's Ensemble**. The Swedish soprano **Karolina Bengtsson** is *Zaide*. Her roles for the company have included Fiordiligi (*Così fan tutte*), Anna (*Blühen*), Sophie (*Werther*), Pamina / Papagena (*Die Zauberflöte*) and Silvia (*Ascanio in Alba*). **Michael Porter** sings the role of Gomatz and **Peter Marsh** is Sultan Soliman. Two bass-baritones, Norwegian born **Aleksander Myrling** (Allazim), who made his house debut as Angelotti (*Tosca*), and **Pete Thanapat** (Osmin), joined the Ensemble last season, and round up the cast for Mozart's Singspiel *Zaide*.
